**RE:** Counties Transit Improvement Board (CTIB) Grant Resolution of Support

The CTIB grant process is underway. Washington County was guaranteed 3% of the total estimated revenue generated for each of the years 2010-2013 to accelerate the development of its transitways. These funds were used to fund the Implementation Plan. As we have worked through the first phases of the Implementation Plan, there are a few tasks that we would like to complete that were not part of the original scope of work. Those items include station planning work for the new stations identified along the BRT routes, support for each city to accurately represent Red Rock in the upcoming comprehensive plan process, and ridership modeling and service planning for additional express bus routes in the corridor that would be implemented to build ridership in the corridor for eventual BRT service.

The typical process for a Red Rock CTIB grant is for Washington County to lead the effort and for each funding partner that is directly impacted by the scope of work and the Commission to approve a resolution of support for the grant. A draft resolution of support is attached.

The proposed budget for this additional scope of work is \$150,000. The Commission would be responsible to provide matching funds of \$15,000 and the CTIB grant would be for \$135,000. Below is a proposed budget breakdown for 2016 with the \$15,000 match and regular operating costs for the Commission (has been \$50,000 for the past few years). As you can see, there is the ability to keep the Commission dues the same from 2015 to 2016 if we draw from fund balance. This will be discussed in more detail at the October meeting along with more detail for the 2016 work plan.

## Resolution Approving the Submittal of an Application to the Counties Transit Improvement Board for Grants Payable in 2016 for the Station Area Planning and Ridership Modeling for the Red Rock Corridor

**WHEREAS**, the Counties Transit Improvement Board (CTIB) has authorized the 2016 Grant Solicitation Process for Grants Payable in 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, Washington, Ramsey, and Dakota Counties have been a members of the CTIB since 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, Washington County was guaranteed three percent of the total estimated revenue generated for each of the years 2010-2013 to accelerate the development of its transitways; and

**WHEREAS**, Washington County has \$4,300,000 remaining in guaranteed funds that have been deferred from past solicitations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Red Rock Corridor is located primarily in Dakota, Ramsey and Washington County, extending approximately 20 miles, and connecting the downtown Saint Paul with its East Side neighborhoods and the suburbs of Newport, Cottage Grove, St. Paul Park, Denmark Township and Hastings; and

**WHEREAS**, the Red Rock Corridor transitway project will provide for transit improvements in the southeastern portion of the Twin Cities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Red Rock Corridor Commission is in the process of completing an Implementation Plan and will identify bus rapid transit (BRT) route and station locations; and

**WHEREAS**, Washington County is requesting a grant from CTIB using its guaranteed funds in the amount of \$135,000 to support more comprehensive station area planning and ridership modeling specific to the BRT route selected through the Implementation Plan process; and

**WHEREAS**, the grant application will be matched by a \$15,000 contribution from the Red Rock Corridor Commission through contributions from Washington County, Hennepin County, Ramsey County and Dakota County.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Red Rock Corridor Commission supports Washington County's application to submit a grant to CTIB in the amount of \$135,000 in guaranteed funds for the development of an Implementation Plan for the Red Rock Corridor.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Red Rock Corridor Commission commits to providing its share of the local match as part of 2015 membership dues.

**RE:** Implementation Plan Update

#### **Background**

An Implementation Plan for phased transit improvements in the corridor, including eventual bus rapid transit (BRT) service, has been underway since the beginning of 2015.

The Implementation Plan goals are to:

- identify more specific construction and capital costs;
- revise station area plans guided by market analysis for bus rapid transit;
- determine a funding plan; and
- establish a staged approach for implementation of the plan.

The Implementation Plan will determine short- and long-term strategies for implementing BRT and to tie those strategies to funding needs. It is expected that the plan will be completed by spring 2016.

#### **Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Alternatives**

At the Map meeting, the Commission approved the consultant team to start developing information on an additional BRT alternative that would provide neighborhood focused access instead of access only along Highway 61. Possible alternatives were vetted by cities along the corridor and amended per their comments. Those amended alternatives were then reviewed by the TAC at the July 20<sup>th</sup> TAC meeting. The Business and Civic Advisory Committee (B-CAC) met on July 22<sup>nd</sup> to review the same alternatives and provided their input. The technical recommendation from the TAC and input from the B-CAC were brought to the Commission in July. At that Commission meeting two alternatives were approved for additional analysis (see maps attached to this memo). We are currently soliciting feedback on the two alternatives via the

Red Rock Corridor website on the "contact us" page. The website questions are seen here. We will focus the engagement around the alternatives on these three questions.

Technical data, including cost and ridership, will be collected and analyzed comparing these two options. The results of the analysis will be previewed with the TAC, B-CAC, and Commission in October. Once all committees have reviewed the technical information, it will be released for public comment. An open house will be held toward the beginning of November as part of the public comment period. Selection of the final route and station locations will likely happen at the November/December Commission meeting presuming the data provides clear direction.

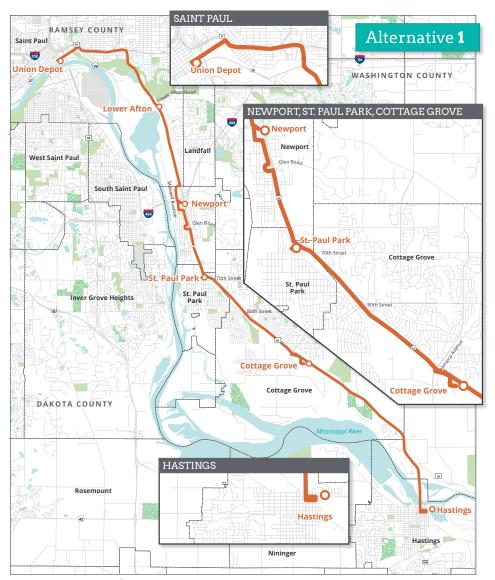

#### Alternative 1

Stations would be located at existing park-and-rides in the Corridor. This alternative would offer the quickest overall trip because the bus travels primarily along Highway 61.



### Alternative 2

Stations would be located within the communities of Newport, St. Paul Park, Cottage Grove, and Hastings. This alternative would offer the best transit connection to Corridor destinations.
